Tutorial - Wrap & Turn

Wrap and turn, or, as it's abbreviated, W&T, is exactly as it sounds. You're gonna wrap a stitch and then turn your work, and I like to remember it with this little I don't know what you would call it, four little moves. Slip, move, slip, move, and that helps me kinda keep things in order.

So you're gonna work until it tells you to, where you're gonna stop and then work the wrap and turn, and in this case, we're going to, with the right side facing, we're gonna slip, move the yarn to the front, slip the stitch back, move the yarn between the needles to the back, and so we have wrapped that stitch that was on the needle, and then you're gonna turn your work. You see how the yarn wraps around the stitch? And you're just going to, for now, pretend that's not even there, and work as normal on the wrong-side row. To work a wrap and turn on a purl stitch, the premise is the same. You're gonna slip, move the yarn to the back, slip the stitch back, remember, we're slipping always as if to purl, and move the yarn back to the front, thereby wrapping that stitch that's on the needle. And turn.

Just like that. So you can see the wrapped stitch there. You can see the wrapped stitch there.
